From our Pastor...



Since Jesus uttered the phrase “Render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar’s, and to God the things that are God’s,” (Matthew 22:21) the followers of Jesus have had some questions to answer: What things belong to Caesar? What things belong to God? What are our responsibilities to Caesar (the rulers of this world) now that we belong to the God who raised Jesus from the dead?

Scripture says, “No one can say ‘Jesus is Lord’ except by the Holy Spirit.” (1 Corinthians 12:3) This statement seems like something very “churchy” to our contemporary ears, but it is anything but. The slogan of loyalty to the Roman Empire, and to its Emperor, was “Caesar is Lord”. To say that “Jesus is Lord” is to recognize that Caesar is no longer Lord. Caesar has a role to play, but he is not the totality of life.

The followers of Jesus made a revolutionary choice when they decided to give their lives to the man from Nazareth, when, inspired by the Holy Spirit, they said “Jesus is Lord!” The early martyrs of the Church were killed precisely because they would not offer incense to the image of the emperor, because they would not even pretend that Caesar was Lord. They would no longer participate in a worship—which by the way, no one else in their day took very seriously—that would call into question their loyalty to Jesus above everyone else.

Following Christ is serious business. A faith that does not effect every aspect of life is not worth very much. The choice to follow Christ, then, has its effect on how we spend our time, how we spend our money, how we select our leaders, where we send our children to school.

This July 4, we praise God for our country and for the great gift of freedom. What does it mean to be free? What gives freedom its greatness? We have the ability to choose, which is definitely a part of freedom. We have the ability to make terrible choices, to waste our freedom on things that are not worthy. But we also have the ability to choose the highest things in life, to give our lives to something that is truly worthy.

The Church proposes that the most worthy thing, the best part of life, is God-become-man, Jesus Christ. He is the only one who is worthy of every ounce of our love, our devotion, our freedom—Jesus is Lord!

All the other good things come after Him. Every other loyalty comes after Him. Being Democrat or being Republican comes after Him. Our favorite sports team comes after Him (seriously). When we get this order right, we live the truth of things. When we get this order wrong, it has terrible consequences for our lives, individually and as a country. One way to say this is that it is good for America to have people that know that America is not God.

“They will know the truth and the truth will set them free!” (John 8:32) What a gift to know the path to freedom, to know the one who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, (John 14:6) Jesus Christ, our Lord.

De Nuestra Párroca...



Desde que Jesús pronunció la frase “Denle a Cesar lo que es de Cesar, y a Dios lo que es de Dios” (Mateo 22:21), los seguidores de Jesús han tenido que contestar algunas preguntas: ¿Qué cosas le pertenecen a Cesar? ¿Qué cosas le pertenecen a Dios? ¿Cuáles son nuestros deberes con Cesar (los líderes de este mundo) ahora que le pertenecemos a Dios, quien resucitó a Jesús de entre los muertos?

Las escrituras nos dicen, “Nadie puede decir ‘Jesús es Señor’ sino con el Espíritu Santo.” (1 Corintios 12:3) Esta expresión nos parece un poco “de doctrina” y “anticuada” para nuestros oídos contemporáneos, pero no es así. El eslogan de lealtad al Imperio Romano y a su emperador era “Cesar es Señor”. El decir que “Jesús es Señor” es reconocer que Cesar ya no es Señor. Cesar tiene un papel que desempeñar, pero ya no es el todo en la vida.

Los seguidores de Jesús tomaron una decisión revolucionaria cuando decidieron darle sus vidas al hombre de Nazaret, cuando, inspirados por el Espíritu Santo, dijeron “¡Jesús es Señor!” Los primeros mártires de la iglesia fueron asesinados precisamente porque no ofrecían incienso a la imagen del emperador, porque ellos no querían ni siquiera pretender que Cesar era Señor. Ellos ya no participaban en un culto—que por cierto, nadie en esos tiempos tomaba muy en serio—que pudiera cuestionar su lealtad a Jesús por encima de todos los demás.

Seguir a Jesús es un asunto muy serio. Una fe que no afecta todos los aspectos de la vida no vale mucho. La decisión de seguir a Cristo, entonces, tiene su efecto en como pasamos nuestro tiempo, como gastamos nuestro dinero, como elegimos a nuestros líderes, a donde enviamos a nuestros niños a la escuela.

Este 4 de julio, alabamos a Dios por nuestro país y por el gran regalo de la libertad. ¿Qué quiere decir ser libres? ¿Qué hace grandiosa la libertad? Nosotros tenemos la habilidad de escoger, que definitivamente es parte de ser libres. Tenemos la libertad de tomar terribles decisiones, de gastar nuestra libertad en cosas que no valen la pena. Pero también tenemos la libertad de escoger las cosas mas grandes en la vida, el dar nuestras vidas a algo que en verdad lo vale.

La iglesia propone que lo más valioso, la mejor parte de la vida, es Dios hecho hombre, Jesucristo. Él es el único que vale cada onza de nuestro amor, nuestra devoción, nuestra libertad—¡Jesús es Señor!

Todas las demás cosas buenas vienen después de Él. Cada una de las lealtades vienen después de Él. Ser demócrata o republicano viene después de Él. Nuestros equipos favoritos de deportes vienen después de Él (en serio). Cuando entendemos este orden correctamente, vivimos la verdad de las cosas. Cuando no entendemos este orden, las consecuencias para nuestras vidas son terribles, individualmente y como país. Una forma de decir esto es que es bueno para América tener gente que sepa que América no es Dios.
