The Church Unity Octave was first celebrated in January, 1908 in the chapel of the Atonement Franciscan Convent in upstate New York. Today, Christians around the world gather in prayer during the week of January 18-25 every year to pray that the scandal of disunity among Christians will be overcome through the action of the Holy Spirit.

The Catholic Church understands "Spiritual Ecumenism" to be the heart of the ecumenical movement. What may be judged to be impossible for us to achieve through human efforts alone is possible as God works in the hearts of all who seek to end the divisions that exist within the Body of Christ of which all people who profess faith in Jesus belong through baptism in real, but presently an imperfect communion.

You are invited to join with Bishop Olmsted and other ecumenical leaders to pray that the will of Jesus, that all will be one in him, may one day be achieved. In 1993 the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity issued the Directory for the Application of Principles and Norms on Ecumenism and explicitly encouraged Catholic participation in the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

Dear friends,

I have some difficult news to share with you today, difficult for both you and me. I am going to step down as pastor of Christ the King, in order to focus on some personal issues that have come up since the death of my parents. You have all been so supportive of me

There is no good time to do something like this. I have been waiting to go and get this help, to take this time, for quite a while. Now seemed like the right time to go. I know that you will all be understanding, even if it is hard. Please know that it is very hard for me too. But we rest in the certainty that our Lord is always at work in our lives, at work through the circumstances that all of us face.

What can you do to help at this time? (1) pray for me and for our beautiful parish; (2) love and support this parish and the new priest who will come. I hope that we all become closer to Jesus, that you will all participate more in the life of the parish, and that you will support the work of the Church even more.

My last weekend will be January 23-24. I will be available to greet everyone after all the Masses today and next week. Although this is difficult, I hope everyone understands that I can't go into all of the details of my life individually with everyone.

Know of my love for you all and of my gratitude for Christ the King Parish. We are united in prayer and in the Eucharist more than we know.

Fr. Tom "Tot" O'Dea, whose love of poetry permeated his life and ministry, died Jan. 2, at home in his native Ireland. He was 82.

Fr. O'Dea crossed the Atlantic Ocean for the Diocese of Tucson where he was ordained on June 7, 1958.

Fr. O'Dea served in various parishes in Tucson and later for the Diocese of Phoenix including St. Thomas the Apostle; Queen of Peace in Mesa; St. Anthony of Padua in Casa Grande; St. Francis in Superior; St. Patrick's in Bisbee; St. John Vianney in Goodyear; St. Matthew; Christ the King in Mesa; and Holy Spirit in Tempe. He retired in 2003 after serving as pastor of Ascension Parish in Fountain Hills, then returned to Ireland in 2005 where he served the parish of Ballynacally for the remaining years of his life.

He was buried Jan. 6, on the grounds of Christ the King Church in Ballycorick, Ballynacally following the funeral Mass.


