Lent is a Journey Back Home to God


Life is a journey. It comes to be and it ceases to be. It has its beginning and it has its end. It begins in the womb and ends in the tomb. In between the span of coming to be and ending makes it a journey. In some ways, the journey is very enjoyable; in other ways, it is not so much. There are times when the journey is marred with anxiety and dread and we can't wait till we get through them. For us, Christians, it is a purposive journey to heaven.

Lent is a coming home to God. I think of the Father in the parable of the prodigal son. He waited every day for his son to return and how happy he was when his boy came home. We cannot forget that we are the beloved sons and daughters of God. God is very patient with us. So often we go wandering away from home. Sometimes it's for years; other times it's for a few days; and still other times it might be for an overnight. God is always standing at the door with arms extended to embrace us. No matter how many times we go wandering, we can always go home. Not seven times, but seventy times seven.

At home, here in Christ the King Parish, God's welcoming embrace is manifested through the sacraments of confession and communion. During this season of Lent, our East Valley deanery has decided to pick some parishes for our priests in the deanery to come and hear confessions. The list and schedule of communal confessions are listed on the cover of this bulletin.

Let us keep each other in prayer as we continue our journey and all those who are making their way to the Church, especially our candidates and catechumens as they prepare for Easter.

The corresponding line on your return tells your tax liability (the amount you owe the state for the year based on your income), which you can pay to Catholic Education Arizona up to the maximum tax credit limits (\$1,087/single or \$2,173/married filing jointly) without going over your tax liability. Make the payment to Catholic Education Arizona www.ceaz.org and designate the school you wish to support. Then, receive a dollar-for-dollar state tax credit, which will help change a child's life forever!

Q. I understand that all the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat, but I'm not sure what is classified as meat. Does meat include chicken and dairy products?

“Abstinence laws consider that meat comes only from animals such as chickens, cows, sheep or pigs -- all of which live on land. Birds are also considered meat. Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat. Thus, such foods as chicken broth, consommé, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are technically not forbidden. However, moral theologians have traditionally taught that we should abstain from all animal-derived products (except foods such as gelatin, butter, cheese and eggs, which do not have any meat taste). Fish are a different category of animal. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles, (cold-blooded animals) and shellfish are permitted.

Q. I understand that Catholics ages 18 to 59 should fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, but what exactly are the rules for these fasts?

A. Fasting on these days means we can have only one full, meatless meal. Some food can be taken at the other regular meal times if necessary, but combined they should be less than a full meal. Liquids are allowed at any time, but no solid food should be consumed between meals.

Q. Are there exemptions other than for age from the requirement to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday?

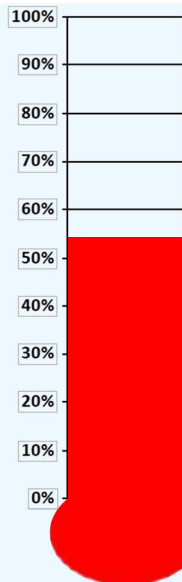
A. Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting. (animals) and shellfish are permitted.”

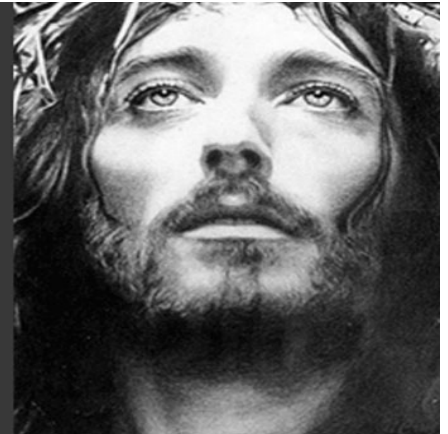

LA CUARESMA ES UN CAMINO DE REGRESO A NUESTRO HOGAR CON DIOS



P. Entiendo que todos los viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia de la carne, pero no estoy seguro de lo que se clasifica como de carne. ¿No incluye la carne de pollo y productos lácteos?

A. Leyes de abstinencia consideran que la carne proviene sólo de animales como pollos, vacas, ovejas o cerdos --- todos los cuales viven en la tierra. Las aves también se consideran carne. La abstinencia no incluye jugos de la carne y alimentos líquidos a base de carne. Por lo tanto, los alimentos tales como caldo de pollo, consomé, sopas cocidas o con sabor a carne, salsas de carne o salsas, así como condimentos o condimentos a base de grasa animal son técnicamente no prohibidas. Sin embargo, los moralistas han enseñado tradicionalmente que debemos abstenernos de todos los productos derivados de animales (excepto los alimentos tales como gelatina, mantequilla, queso y huevos, que no tienen ningún sabor de la carne). Los peces son una categoría diferente de animal. De sal y de agua dulce especies de peces, anfibios, reptiles, (animales de sangre fría) se permiten y mariscos.

P: Tengo entendido que los católicos de entre 18 y 59 deben ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo, pero ¿Cuáles son las reglas para estos ayunos?

A. El ayuno en estos días significa que podemos tener sólo una comida completa sin carne. Otras dos comidas pequeñas se pueden comer, si es necesario, pero combinadas deben ser menos de la comida completa. Los líquidos se les permite en cualquier momento, pero comida sólida no se debe consumir entre comidas.

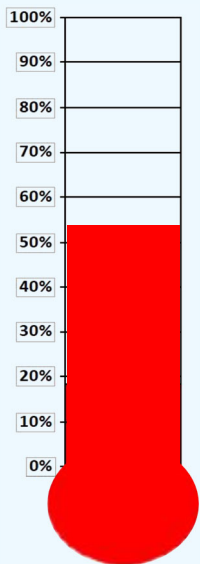
Q . ¿Hay excepciones afuera de la edad para el ayuno del Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo?

A. Los que están dispensados del ayuno y abstinencia fuera de los límites de edad son gente con enfermedades físicas o mentales, incluyendo los individuos que sufren de enfermedades crónicas como la diabetes. También están excluidas las mujeres embarazadas o en lactancia. En todos los casos, el sentido común debe prevalecer, y las personas enfermas no deben poner en peligro aún más su salud por ayunar.

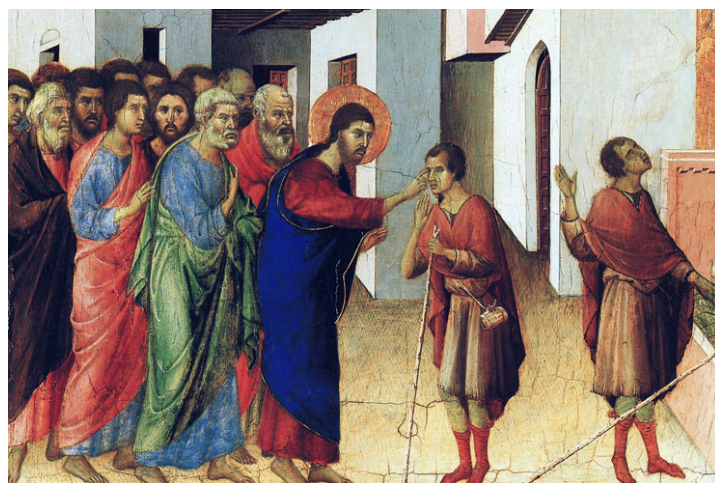

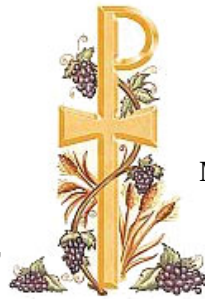
