The Impact of Pilgrimage to Poland

Last June 8-19, 2017 a group of 20 pilgrims set foot to Poland led by Mike Richard, our parishioner. Some 4 others joined the group on June 12, 2017. One of the highlights of the pilgrimage that set the tone for this journey of faith was the Eucharist on the Feast of Corpus Christi, which was celebrated at the Royal Archcathedral Basilica of Sts. Stanislaus and Wenceslaus on the Wawel Hill on Thursday, June 15, 2017. Thousands attended the Mass from all walks of life, and some of them in their uniforms like the university professors, the Brotherhood of the Rooster of Krakow, church organizations, and representatives of the Polish army, among others. The newly appointed Archbishop Marek Jedraszwecki, of the Archdiocese of Krakow, presided the Mass and was joined by his retired predecessor, Cardinal Dziwisz, who was a personal friend and close collaborator of St. John Paul II, other bishops, priests from the archdiocese, visiting priests from England, and myself. What drew the people together was neither the Cardinal nor the Archbishop nor the interesting character of the Cathedral, where St. Stanislaus' mausoleum occupied the center of the Cathedral's nave, patron of Poland and the 11th c. Krakow Bishop/martyr, the coronation site of monarchs until 17th c., the various top class of art styles, like Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque, and the burial site of most Polish royalty as well as the greatest national heroes, poets, saints and countless Krakow bishops. Rather, it was Jesus who made the place and the event holy. He says: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in their midst (Mt. 18:20).

Pilgrimages date back to early medieval ages. They were recognized as expressions of Christian piety. The medieval period Christians believed that God was so distant and it was through physical journey that the gap between them and God would be closed and their spiritual goal would be achieved.

As in the past, the pilgrims set out to fulfill a vow or a promise, to be sorry for the sins committed, to seek miraculous cure and/or well-being of a family member and to deepen his or her faith. The earliest pilgrims until the pilgrims of today wish to see the places where Jesus lived. And it is Jerusalem. But Our Lady of Calvary situated in a 400-hectare complex that includes the 17th-century Baroque Church dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Bernardine Monastery of the same age, serves as substitute of Jerusalem and is considered a holy place.

Sacred architecture of different styles like Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque and Romanesque complemented the interior meditations of pilgrims to the holy sites. The distinctive features of these buildings were copied in miniatures and made as souvenirs for pilgrims and tourists. In most of the sites we visited, were the presence of holy relics, material objects like the bones or clothes of the saints, the sight or touch of which was supposed to draw the faithful nearer to saintliness. One pilgrim boy who picked the name St. John Paul II on his confirmation received the scapular from the Carmelite Father where St. John Paul visited and received a scapular with his father a day after his first communion and confirmation. During this pilgrimage an idea finally dawned on me to transform the alcove between the two confessional boxes of our church into a prayer area where penitents can pray before the image of the Divine Mercy and, hopefully, with the relic of St. Faustina, for the forgiveness of their sins and for healing.

The church endorses pilgrimages, for example, a pilgrimage to Fatima on its 100th year anniversary, when the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three little children in Fatima. Our Fatima may not necessarily be in Portugal, but, like Our Lady of Calvary in Poland, may be right here in our place.

What are more laudable are our heartfelt goals to gain a plenary indulgence, that is, a guarantee of the prayer of the Church for dispensation from the temporal punishment for sins confessed and forgiven. We believe that the Church's prayer will be heard because of her holiness.

Thank you very much for your prayers during those 12 days of our journey. We, too, prayed for you, especially during the Masses we celebrated in holy sites.

El impacto del peregrinaje a Polonia

El pasado 8-19 de junio, 2017 un grupo de 20 peregrinos viajaron a Polonia guiados por Mike Richard, párroco nuestro. Otros 4 se unieron al grupo el 12 de junio, 2017. Algo que destacó en el peregrinaje, y que estableció las pautas de esta travesía de fe, fue la Eucaristía en la festividad de Corpus Christi, que se celebró el jueves 15 de junio, 2017 en la Basílica de la Catedral de San Estanislao y San Wenceslao en Wawel Hill. Miles de personas de diferentes tipos asistieron a la misa, algunos de ellos en sus uniformes, como profesores de universidad, la Hermandad del Gallo en Cracovia, organizaciones de la iglesia, y representantes del servicio militar de Polonia, entre otros. El recién nombrado Arzobispo Marek Jedraszweski, de la Arquidiócesis de Cracovia, presidió la misa y concelebró con su predecesor jubilado, el Cardenal Dziwisz, quien era amigo personal y colaborador íntimo de San Juan Pablo II, también otros obispos y sacerdotes de la arquidiócesis, sacerdotes visitantes de Inglaterra, y su servidor. Lo que atrajo a la gente no fue ni el Cardenal, ni el Arzobispo, ni el carácter de la Catedral, en donde el mausoleo de San Estanislao, santo patrón de Polonia y Obispo de Cracovia y mártir del siglo 11, y sitio de coronación de monarcas hasta el siglo 17, ni los estilos de alta clase de arte gótico, de renacimiento y barroco, donde se enterraron la mayoría de la realeza polaca, así como héroes nacionales, poetas, santos y un sinnúmero de obispos de Cracovia. Más bien, fue Jesús quien hizo santo el lugar y el evento. Él dice: "Donde están dos o tres reunidos en Mi Nombre, allí estoy Yo, en medio de ellos (Mt. 18:20).

Los peregrinajes datan a la época medieval temprana. Se reconocían como expresiones de devoción religiosa. Los cristianos de la época medieval creían que Dios estaba tan distante y que el viaje físico acortaba la brecha entre Dios y ellos, y así alcanzaban su meta espiritual.

Así como en el pasado, los peregrinos salieron de viaje para cumplir un juramento o una promesa de arrepentirse por los pecados cometidos, para buscar un remedio milagroso y/o el bienestar de un familiar, y para profundizar su fe. Desde los primeros peregrinos hasta los del día de hoy, desean ver los lugares donde Jesús vivió. Y ese lugar es Jerusalén. Pero Nuestra Señora del Calvario está situada en un complejo de 400 hectáreas que incluye la iglesia barroca del siglo 17 dedicada a la Santísima Virgen María y al Monasterio Bernardino de la misma época, sirve como lugar sustituto de Jerusalén y es considerado un lugar sagrado.

La arquitectura sagrada de diferentes estilos barrocos, de renacimiento y románicos, complementaba las meditaciones interiores de los peregrinos a los lugares sagrados. Las características distintivas de estos edificios han sido replicadas en miniatura como souvenirs para los peregrinos y turistas. En la mayoría de los sitios que visitamos había la presencia de reliquias sagradas, objetos materiales como los huesos o ropa de algunos santos, que al tocar o verlos se suponía queatraía a las personas de fe más cerca de la santidad. Un niño peregrino que escogió el nombre de San Juan Pablo II para su confirmación, recibió el escapulario del Padre Carmelita donde visitó San Juan Pablo; lo recibió con su padre el día después de su primera comunión y confirmación. Durante este peregrinaje se me ocurrió una idea finalmente de transformar el rincón entre los dos confesionarios de nuestra iglesia, en un área donde los penitentes puedan orar ante la imagen de la Divina Misericordia, y, esperemos, con la reliquia de Sta. Faustina, para el perdón de sus pecados y recibir sanación.

La iglesia patrocina peregrinajes, como por ejemplo un peregrinaje a Fátima en su centésimo aniversario, cuando la Santísima Virgen María se apareció ante tres niños en Fátima. Puede que nuestra Fátima no esté en Portugal, pero, como Nuestra Señora del Calvario en Polonia, puede estar aquí en nuestro lugar.

Lo que son aún más laudables son nuestras metas sinceras de alcanzar una indulgencia plenaria, que es una garantía de la oración de la Iglesia para la dispensa del castigo temporal por los pecados confesados y perdonados. Nosotros creemos que la oración de la Iglesia, por su santidad, será escuchada.

Muchas gracias por sus oraciones durante esos 12 días de nuestro viaje. Nosotros también oramos por ustedes especialmente durante las misas que celebramos en los lugares sagrados.


