Thank You Very Much

I remember I wrote in our annual report that we were expecting a financial health problem because our monthly income was way below the budget last year, and I quote:

"Unfortunately, we are expecting a financial health problem. The bad news is mostly money. Our monthly income on average is falling roughly \$7,500.00 short to meet our monthly budget. And if the shortage continues, we may be forced to dip into our savings. I am appealing to increase your giving to avoid any financial crisis and to meet our annual expenses. We are trying to cut our expenses without negatively affecting the life of the parish."

I showed no worry but rather great understanding knowing that you continuously love and generously give your best to make this parish a better community. I said:

"I understand that some of you live on your retirement funds; widowed; are receiving fixed income or are living within poverty level. Please don't feel sad or guilty when you hear me say this knowing that you give little or can't give more. Instead, I would like everyone to accept my heartfelt gratitude for your continuing love and generosity in helping build this parish community in whatever best way you can."

Under the framework of good governance, where we competently manage our parish resources and affairs in a manner that is open, transparent, accountable and responsive to the needs of the parishioners, I highly encourage not only to continue but to improve our good practices and deepen our love of God, as narrated:

"I've been receiving feedback that our church is welcoming and our courtyard serves its purpose in bringing the parishioners together, a communion that emanates from the love of the Lord. Our parish needs all of us to foster and strengthen this communal spirit. The more we participate together, the more willing we become to support prayerfully and financially the church we believe in."

Thank you very much for responding positively to the challenges that come our way especially in transforming our parish community. I said:

"Your response to these challenges will help shape the future of our parish community."

It is a fact that there were and still are many hurdles in running the parish. But sincere leadership with proper management can do wonders. Recall the "snowflake model" of leadership. Leaders develop and enable other leaders. Responsibility is distributed and every parishioner is aware of his or her duties and plays his/her role sincerely. In such cooperative environment and with the grace of God, our parish income has increased, thus making our parish financially healthy.

Christ the King Parish held a Ministry Fair, the first in the last few years. From the event, fourteen ministries report increased involvement and participation in the variety of ministries offered here at Christ the King.

While only 90 families returned their forms during our commitment period, there was an overall increase in time and treasure. Our parishioners are sharing their many talents and together we feel gratitude because we are working together, and working for a common goal.

Next in the Grateful Discipleship movement is to establish a committee who will lead the parish in developing grateful attitudes in order to share a portion of time, talent and treasure with the parish and the poor, to build up the church and make this a better world.

This group of twelve diverse parishioners would assume responsibility for an annual Ministry Fair, renewal and ongoing formation of disciples, including a new parishioner welcome and other community building and service projects. They might also embrace the task of organizing the work of communicating the stewardship message using a variety of media outlets and other activities as determined by the needs of the parish.
