## From the Pastor's Desk

### It's All About Gratitude to the Lord!

A Jesuit writer, Anthony de Mello, S.J., wrote:

The wise man had reached the outskirts of the village and settled down under a tree for the night when a villager came running up to him and said, "The stone! The stone! Give me the precious stone!" "What stone?" asked the wise man.

"Last night in a dream," said the villager, "God told me that if I went to the outskirts of the village at dusk I should find a wise man who would give me a precious stone that would make me rich forever." The wise man rummaged in his bag and pulled out a stone. "He probably meant this one," he said, as he handed the stone over to the villager. "I found it on a forest path some days ago. You can certainly have it."

The man gazed at the stone in wonder. It was a diamond, probably the largest diamond in the whole world, for it was as large as a person's head.

He took the diamond and walked away. All night he tossed about in bed, unable to sleep. Next day at the crack of dawn he woke the wise man and said, "Give me the wealth that makes it possible for you to give this diamond away so easily."

The story came to mind when I was preparing this report. Challenged by the magnitude of the parish work, the parish budget, the Charity and Development Appeal (CDA) and the Diocesan Campaign "Let Us Go Forth – Juntos Sigamos Adelante," I feel like a villager who is searching for the wealth that will make possible the giving so easily. We have a budget deficit of \$27,910.5 (as of 10/14/2018); CDA annual goal of \$125,000.00 and a Campaign goal of \$1,917,641.00 in 5 years. The numbers may seem like a daunting amount. But, we know, with God all things are possible. However, what are we going to do, as parishioners of Christ the King, to meet this challenge? The good news is that there is a way to do this. But it will require the participation of the entire parish. This is the wealth that I have been searching for. I am asking all to make sacrifices for the kingdom of God in the form of our time, talent, and treasure.



St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray. And do thou, oh Prince of the Heavenly Host, by the Power of God, thrust into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

I am asking all to prayerfully consider how much each one can give to God here in Christ the King parish. Our parish is blessed in many ways. We have a beautiful church and courtyard. We have the best Catholic grade school in the East Valley. We teach and prepare some 400 students for baptism, first communion and confirmation. We have a 24/7 Perpetual Adoration and a St. Peregrine Cancer Shrine that responds to the spiritual needs of cancer patients, not only from this country but also from 15 other countries. We have the Community Center where HOPE (Food) Ministry, St. Vincent de Paul Society and Mission of Mercy are hosted to help the needy. We are, indeed, blessed.

I understand that some of you live on your retirement funds; widowed; are receiving fixed income or are living within poverty level. Please don't feel sad or guilty when you hear me say this knowing that you give little or can't give more. Instead, I would like everyone to accept my heartfelt gratitude for your continuing love and generosity in helping build this parish community, over and above your weekly tithe, the CDA, and other charity works, in whatever best way you can.

Truly, we can never out-give God. I know, I have tried at times. I cannot explain it, the numbers do not work, but every time I have been generous to the Lord, He has blessed me beyond measure. We do not give to get back in return, we give because we are blessed.


On my part, First, I commit to you to be a good steward of our parish resources and continue to be transparent in our finances. We will publish the progress as we grow. I know the difficult decisions we all must make in life, and I know the blessings of committing everything to the Lord. This is about more than just fundraising. It is about our gratitude to the Lord for all He has done for us.

Second, I commit to give every month to the Diocesan campaign in addition to what I am giving to educate some children in a poor community and children with disability in the Philippines. The Lord has been so good to me, and I ask: "How can I repay the Lord for his goodness to me?" (Ps. 116).






## Marthas
